

Mail-In Ballot FAQs

When can I expect to receive my ballot?

Mail-In Ballots for the General Election will be mailed out the week of **October 6, 2008**

What if my ballot does not arrive?

If your General Election ballot does not arrive by October 24th, please call the Clerk & Recorder's office at (303) 271-8111.

I spoiled my ballot, now what do I do?

Please call the Clerk & Recorder's office at (303) 271-8111 or stop by our office at the Jefferson County Courthouse. Our address is 100 Jefferson County Parkway, Suite 2560, Golden, 80419. You may obtain a replacement ballot during normal business hours from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

What do I do with my ballot?

We encourage you to get your ballot back to us as soon as possible after you have voted. You can either mail it back to us using **two \$0.42 first-class postage stamps** or bring it to any one of eleven mail-in ballot drop-off locations throughout Jefferson County. I want to vote at the polls. Can I change my mind on a mail ballot?

Unfortunately it is too late to change your mind for the General Election. Individuals who have signed up to receive a mail ballot for the General Election must cast their mail-in ballot in order

to vote in this election. If you visit the polls on Election Day, you will be required to vote on a provisional ballot.

I've heard that mail-in ballots are only counted if a race is close. Is this true?

No. All mail-in ballots cast by eligible voters before 7 p.m. on November 4th will be counted.

How do I know you received my ballot?

You can now track you ballot online at www.votejeffco.com. Click on the "Look up my voter registration" link, type in your first and last name, date of birth and residence address number. This will bring up you voter information screen. At the bottom of the screen, there will be a display showing the date your mail-in ballot application was processed, the date the ballot was mailed to you, and the date your voted ballot was received and processed.
